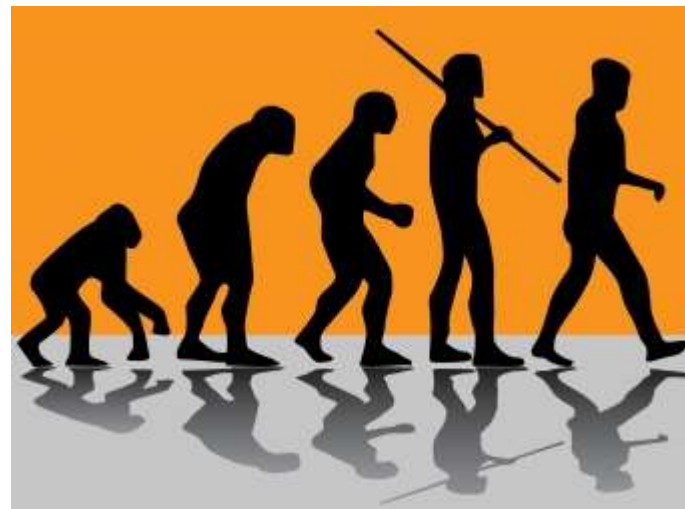

... to enable us to connect to the new ideas, the new future – the new evolution.

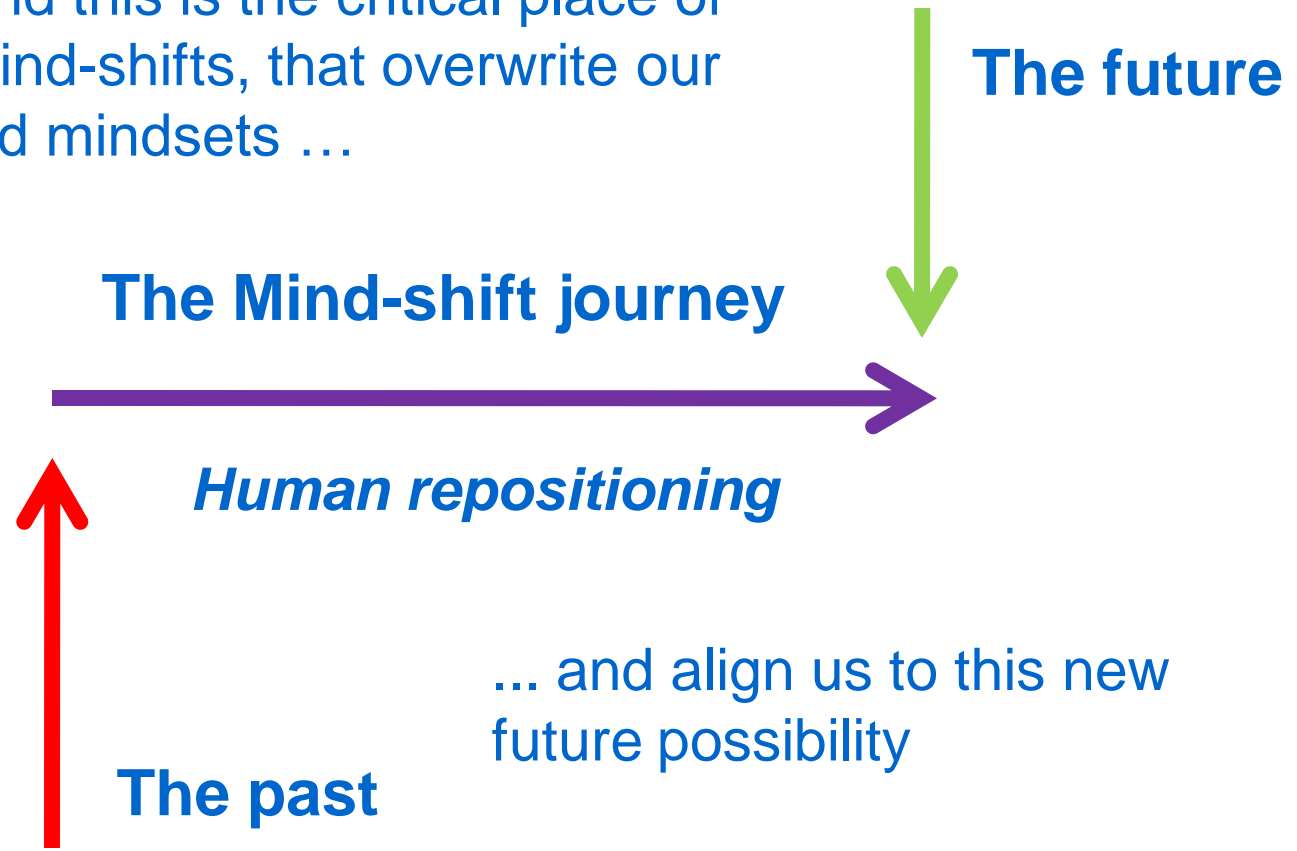
